As individuals and friends, we will...

- Develop friendships with other children.
- Learn to use the toilet with help, and then independently.
- Develop their sense of responsibility and membership of a community.
- Select and use activities and resources, with help when needed. This helps them to achieve a goal they have chosen, or one which is suggested to them.

As communicators, we will...

- Generally, focus on an activity of their own choice.
- Listen to other people's talk.
- Start to say how they are feeling, using words as well as actions.
- Listen to simple stories and understand what is happening, with the help of the pictures.
- Identify familiar objects and properties for practitioners when they are described. For example: 'Katie's coat', 'blue car', 'shiny apple'.
- Understand and act on longer sentences like 'make teddy jump' or 'find your coat'.

As healthy movers, we will...

- Use large and small motor skills to do things independently, for example manage buttons and zips, and pour drinks.
- Explore different materials and tools.
- Develop their movement, balancing, riding (scooters, trikes and bikes) and ball skills.
- Go up steps and stairs, or climb up apparatus, using alternate feet
- Use large-muscle movements to wave flags and streamers, paint and make marks.
- Use one-handed tools and equipment, for example, making snips in paper with scissors.



This term our topic is All About Me!

As readers and writers, we will...

- Enjoy drawing freely.
- Add some marks to their drawings, which they give meaning to. For example: "That says mummy."
- Make marks on their picture to stand for their name.
- Notice some print, such as the first letter of their name, a bus or door number, or a familiar logo.
- Have favourite books and seek them out, to share with an adult, with another child, or to look at alone.
- Repeat words and phrases from familiar stories.

As mathematicians, we will...

- Compare sizes, weights etc. using gesture and language 'bigger/ little/smaller', 'high/low', 'tall', 'heavy'.
- Notice patterns and arrange things in patterns.
- Make comparisons between objects relating to size, length, weight and capacity.

As explorers and investigators,

we will...

- Make connections between the features of their family and other families.
- $\bullet \quad \hbox{Notice differences between people}.$
- Use all their senses in hands-on exploration of natural materials.
- Begin to make sense of their own lifestory and family's history.

As artists, actors and musicians,

we will...


- Explore different materials, using all their senses to investigate them.
 Manipulate and play with different materials.
- Use their imagination as they consider what they can do with different materials.
- Make simple models which express their ideas.
- Create closed shapes with continuous lines, and begin to use these shapes to represent objects.
- Draw with increasing complexity and detail, such as representing a face with a circle and including details.
- Explore colour and colour-mixing.

This term our focus stories are based around families and starting school and we have three focus stories:






<u>Reception – Autumn 1 – Stories from Our Favourite Authors</u>


